- More than **211,000 individuals** in CD-9 – one-in-four district residents – are enrolled on AHCCCS:
 - 149,000 enrollees in “traditional” Medicaid populations (mostly children)
 - 54,000 adults in expansion populations
 - 8,000 individuals who have an age-related disability, physical disability, or intellectual or developmental disabilities and require institutional level of care; most services are provided in individuals’ homes and other community-based settings
- AHCCCS covers more than **89,000 children** in CD-9, 45 percent of all children in the district

- AHCCCS and contracted health plans **paid more than \$1.8 billion to providers** who delivered treatment to CD-9 residents, including:
 - \$634.4 million paid to hospitals
 - \$382.7 million paid to long-term care providers such as in-home care, nursing homes and other residential care, and home health
 - \$191.4 million paid to behavioral health providers, including inpatient and outpatient supports
 - \$258.8 million paid to physicians, therapists, dentists, and other practitioners

Notes

- Enrollment counts are as of January 2025 and include individuals receiving comprehensive Medicaid benefits; individuals enrolled in KidsCare, those receiving only Medicare cost-sharing, and similar groups are excluded. Comparisons to total district populations are based on 2023 estimates from the Census Bureau's American Community Survey (the most recent data available).
- Diagnosis counts reflect individuals who received any treatment for the reported conditions during federal fiscal year 2024 (October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024).
- Spending figures include payments made for services (both by managed care organizations and by AHCCCS through fee-for-service) for district residents and as well as supplemental payments to hospitals in federal fiscal year 2024 (October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024).
- Figures in some tables may not sum due to rounding.
