

Tribal Dental Benefit (HB 2244) Waiver Request Fact Sheet


Recognizing the importance of oral health care, Governor Ducey, in partnership with the Arizona legislature, restored the Medicaid adult dental benefits that were eliminated during the Great Recession.

- In **2016**, the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) implemented a dental benefit of \$1,000 per member per contract year for adults enrolled in the Arizona Long Term Care System (ALTCS) program.
- In **2017**, AHCCCS implemented an emergency dental benefit of \$1,000 per member per contract year for adult AHCCCS members.
- In 2020, HB 2244, authorized AHCCCS to seek approval from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to reimburse Indian Health Service and Tribal 638 facilities to cover the cost of adult dental services that are eligible for 100% Federal Medical Assistance Percentages (FMAP), that are in excess of the \$1,000 limit.

The tribal dental benefit waiver request strives to improve oral health among American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) members and provide the IHS and Tribal 638 facilities with needed financial resources to attract dentists to practice on tribal reservations and rural areas.

Al/AN adults suffer from untreated tooth decay at twice the rate of the general U.S. population. For example, among 35-49 year olds, 27% of the general U.S. population has untreated cavities compared to 64% of Al/AN dental patients.
