Cyrcahealth Review & Recommendation

Cyrcahealth's heart/lung transplant reviewer, Dr. Jackie O'Donnell (Krannert Institute of Cardiology, Heart-Lung Transplant Program, Clarian, Indianapolis) has reviewed the proposed changes to the AHCCCS heart transplant policy and agrees that heart-lung transplantation is not a good option for most adults and that, if identified early enough, many of these patients could successfully undergo lung transplant only.

Recommendation: Proposed policy changes as submitted for review should stand.
