Dear President Petersen, Speaker Toma, and Chairmen Kavanagh and Livingston:

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 36-2925, subsection H, AHCCCS is submitting this status report on the agreement between AHCCCS and the State of Hawaii for data processing activities using the AHCCCS Prepaid Medicaid Management Information System (PMMIS). This report summarizes the financial and operational activities for the Interstate Agreement between AHCCCS and the Med-QUEST Division/Department of Human Services for Hawaii.

In accordance with A.R.S. § 36-2927, Intergovernmental Services Funds have been set up to deposit the monies received from Hawaii and to account for the expenditures that are incurred on its behalf. Chart 1 (attached) summarizes the revenues and expenditures of monies from these funds for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2023. We currently work with Hawaii on the following:





- 1. On-going Hawaii Operations and Maintenance Support. Arizona continues to provide support for ongoing operations and maintenance for the Hawaii PMMIS (HPMMIS). Hawaii is charged for work done by the AHCCCS Information Technology (IT) staff and independent contractors, a designated percentage of other specified AHCCCS personnel in IT, direct Hawaii costs, and a portion of AHCCCS indirect operating costs which benefit the project.
- 2. Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program Business Information Solutions (MACBIS). This project better enables the states to collect data in a more timely and synchronized manner to create an integrated view of the programs for better decisionmaking. This project has been implemented for both States. There are ongoing data needs and data improvements as requested by CMS that are currently in process.
- 3. On-going Hawaii Operations and Maintenance Support for the Data Warehouse Systems. Arizona continues to provide support for the Hawaii Decision Support System.
- 4. Medicaid Enterprise System Roadmap. The PMMIS and HPMMIS are run on technology that is in excess of 30 years old. The continued support of this technology is at risk due to the lack of trained personnel entering the workforce. As a result, both states have entered into an agreement to research how to further our partnership and modernize the technology that supports both states. The roadmap is living document that requires updates as technology changes and portions of the roadmap are implemented.
- 5. Medicaid Enterprise System Modernization: This is largest joint state task. The states have begun modernizing the 30 year old system. We are actively working on phase 1 which is system integration. A system integrator has been onboarded and work has started. The goal of the system integrator is to link all individual pieces of the MES together to make them a seamless, integrated system. Modules include, provider registration, HPMMIS, data warehouse, operational data store, electronic data interchange, and many others.

HAPA Savings

Financial activities for the HAPA Savings fund, which was set up to track the dollars related to the savings achieved due to the HAPA Project, are illustrated in Chart 1A (attached).





Project Summary

As a result of this joint venture, both states have been able to share costs, knowledge and strategies for more efficient day to day operations as well as for special projects. We continue to serve as a model for other state joint ventures and look forward to many more years working together with continued success.
